Subject: CRA/LA Excess Bond Proceeds Project Status Report as of September 15, 2023

On January 16, 2015, the City of Los Angeles (City) and CRA/LA, a Designated Local Authority (CRA/LA), entered into a Bond Expenditure Agreement (BEA: C.F. 14-1174; Contract C-125212) for the purpose of transferring an initial \$84.1 million in Non-Housing Excess Bond Proceeds (EBP) to the City as a result of the dissolution of the City's former redevelopment agency. Since the initial allocation, the City received an additional \$1.9 million in FY 2017-18 and \$2.4 million in FY 2019-20 for a total of approximately \$88.4 million in principal funds. After the inclusion of \$8.3 million in interest earnings, the sum total of EBP proceeds as of June 30, 2023 is approximately \$96.7 million.

In response to a motion (C.F. 20-066; Blumenfield – Harris-Dawson), the attached report is the seventh CRA/LA EBP Project Status Report, which provides an overview of key program highlights and outlines the implementation status of each EBP project as of September 15, 2023. This report provides expenditure data as of June 30, 2023 and project status as of September 15, 2023 because expenditure data requires additional processing time and project status information is more readily available.

The City has expended about \$49.7 million to date on 79 projects in former redevelopment areas throughout Los Angeles. Of these 79 projects, 44 projects have been completed and 30 projects are in progress and five (5) projects are being actively reprogrammed. The remaining balance of approximately \$47 million must be expended prior to the January 15, 2025 deadline.

I. OVERVIEW

The Bond Expenditure Agreement (BEA) (Contract C-125212; Council File 14-1174), executed on January 16, 2015 between the City of Los Angeles and CRA/LA, transferred **CRA/LA Excess Non-Housing Bond Proceeds (EBP)** to the City to implement economic and community development activities.

The City's CRA/LA Bond Oversight Committee (BOC), consists of the City Administrative Officer, the Chief Legislative Analyst, and the Mayor's Office, and is responsible for evaluating the proposed Bond expenditures, ensuring that these expenditures are consistent with the Bond covenants, and making detailed program and budget recommendations to Mayor and Council on EBP appropriations.

Under the BEA, the City received CRA/LA EBP totaling \$84,071,895 on February 2, 2015, and additional transfers of \$1,900,530 on March 28, 2018 and \$2,427,927 on July 9, 2019. The aggregate EBP of \$88,400,352 was deposited into Fund 57D, and as required by the BEA was segregated into various accounts to ensure accurate tracking by project area, bond series, and taxable versus tax-exempt EBP allocations. The City must expend all funds on eligible projects and activities by January 15, 2025.

This report includes an overview of the total \$96,710,401 allocated for project implementation and staff administration as of June 30, 2023. The current implementation status of all projects receiving EBP appropriations is detailed in Attachment 2, and this project status information is current through September 15, 2023.

This report provides expenditure data as of June 30, 2023 and project status updates as of September 15, 2023 because expenditure data requires processing time and project status information is more readily available. It should be noted that additional project activities may have taken place during the preparation of this report.

II. PROJECT ENCUMBRANCES AND EXPENDITURES

As of June 30, 2023, the City has approved project-specific and administrative appropriations totaling \$96,710,401 or 100 percent of EBP. Of this amount, \$7,372,402 is for allowable administrative costs. There have been no additional appropriations as of September 15, 2023. Tables 1-3 below reflect various snapshots of the total accumulated EBP funds available, expenditures, interest and unspent funds (sums may not total due to rounding).

III. PROGRAM AND PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

The City is allocating its EBP funds to initiate and complete programs and projects covering the four broad categories deemed eligible in the Bond Expenditure Agreement: (A) public infrastructure, (B) community facilities and open space (C) affordable housing, and (D) business assistance and catalytic commercial developments. **Projects in bold print are completed.**

(A) Public Infrastructure:

The City has leveraged a combination of public and private funding in order to take advantage of opportunities to invest in existing public infrastructure programs. These projects will result in increased access to public art in the San Fernando Valley, completion of additional Safe Routes to School projects at high-need elementary schools, neighborhood enhancement projects to remove graffiti and nuisance issues, art installation and mural programs, and stormwater sustainability projects to help with flood reduction.

Streetscape and Pedestrian Improvement Projects

- Normandie Pedestrian Improvements

(B) Community Facilities and Open Space:

Community facilities are places where constituents gather for leisure, recreation, education, and activities that strengthen the community fabric. The projects listed below reflect the diverse spaces the City is upgrading to serve the City's many unique communities.

(C) Affordable Housing:

Affordable housing is one of the City's most acute needs. Several council offices have expended funds on pivotal projects that will add to the supply of affordable housing stock for families, seniors, and the homeless.

- <u>Casa Carmen Senior Apartments</u>: 24-unit affordable housing apartment for seniors in the Pico Union area
- Reseda Theater/Camby Acquisition: Mixed-use senior affordable housing project and Reseda Theater restoration in Reseda
- <u>First and Boyle</u>: Environmental site study to support permanent supportive housing development in Boyle Heights

(D) Business Assistance and Catalytic Commercial Developments:

The EBP funds are critical to providing investment opportunities for private organizations uniquely positioned to spur catalytic growth through the City's investment/loan programs. Using the EBP funds, the City looks to realize two long-term goals: (1) establishing a culinary arts program and partnership between Mission College and local entrepreneurs in the San Fernando Valley, and (2) expanding cultural programming and access to arts programming throughout the City.
